Public Open Forum:

Despite County Cllr Mark Winnington not being here Mr Robert Eld wished to bring to the attention of councillors the persistent noise on the Seighfeld Airfield site since last August and would like to know why the Borough Council is not doing anything and why they have not heard anything back? Mr Eld said the noise was over the limit and asked for the Parish Council to make further enquiries into this.

5	20/03/23/5 Meeting of the Parish Council held on 16 January 2023:
	 a) The minutes of the meeting were approved as a correct record and were signed. Proposed by Cllr Brown. Seconded Cllr Busby. Unanimous b) Matters arising not covered elsewhere on the agenda.
	Re cutting ivy off telephone kiosk. Cllr Busby will remove ivy. Painting is a bigger job and required prep work first. Councillors discussed getting someone external to paint it.
	Action Cllr Hayward proposed getting a quotation for painting the kiosk and will look into this
	Cllr Wilkes reported that they had still not heard from Cllr Winnington regarding putting a chicane on the Greenway. There are two other chicanes in other places. The shared use of the pathway is dangerous. Cllr Wilkes said he is not satisfied with the lack of Cllr Winnington's response and doesn't feel that the issue has been taken seriously. Action

7	20/03/23/7 Parish Councillors Report:
	Derrington Cllr Allen confirmed the pot holes have been filled in on the car park at Castle View Flats. Cllr Allen recently attended the Derrington Village Hall Meeting and reported that the village are interested in celebrating the King's Coronation in the village.
	Cllr Allen suggested moving the plaque by the cherry tree to the other side so it doesn't get damaged by cars.
	Cllr Wilkes spoke to the Church Warden re dog fouling on the Church. The Warden said there isn't a problem with people using the cut through but there is a problem with dogs off the lead, fouling and running over the graves. They are going to put signs up but asked if the council could provide any funding for

the signs. The Chairman thought there could be a problem with this request because historically parish councils are precluded from funding churches. The Church Warden said we can use the water to clean the park and to just let them know when we need it.
Cllr Busby reported that he had met Roy Wood of the Derrington Millennium Trust and alterations had been made to the main access to the Millennium Green to provide two more parking spaces and parking is a lot better now.
<u>Great Bridgeford</u> Cllr Turnbull reported that litter was a problem and seems to be getting worse. At a recent litter pick 26 bags were filled when normally there would be 12 bags.
The Community Speed Watch team are starting in April but are still waiting for the signs to go up.
Cllr Hodgkins had repaired the wire fence to the playing field in one place but some of the trees need trimming. The Chairman asked if Cllr Hodgkins could trim the trees as well to which he agreed.

<u>Seighford</u> Cllr Hodgkins reported that Smithy Lane has a drain full of silt and needs sucking out. It is thought the drain is the responsibility of Housing Plus. <u>Action</u>

20/03/23/8 Chairman's report:
There is a recurring flooding problem in the northern section of Dale Lane, Haughton below the railway bridge which is on the border with Seighford Parish and which Councillor Ian Sunley, Chairman of Haughton Parish Council had visited and he suggested that Seighford be involved. The Chairman met local resident Mr Peter Godwin there on 22 nd February. The floods had abated by the time of the visit but Mr Godwin was able to give a detailed explanation of the problems. The piped drainage system is blocked and the adjoining ditches need cleaning out. There is run off from polytunnels on the adjoining land which adds to the problems. A meeting took place with County Councillor Mark Winnington on 7 th March and the outcome of the meeting was that he agreed to ask Diane Firkins of County Highways to meet him on site to agree remedial works.

	opposite the Green, Millian Brook Road, Seighford and Stafford Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority, whereby the applicants in carrying out the construction of two new houses agreed to transfer the remaining undeveloped land to the Parish Council to be used as an extension to the Village Green. The agreement provides, inter alia, for amenity works to be carried out to the land before the date of the first occupation of any dwelling and for the transfer of the land to the Parish Council to take place before the occupation of the second house which was on 1 st October 2017. However, the landscaping
	works carried out are not in accordance with the agreement and the land has not been transferred. In addition, the northern boundary was set out by the Borough Council's Enforcement Officer so as to give the two adjoining two owners 45m2 of land to which they had no legal title. When this happened, the adjoining house owners must have thought that Christmas had come early. In 2019 the Parish Council made an informal complaint to the Borough Council but the matter is still unresolved.
	The Chairman proposed that the Parish Council write to the Leader of the Borough Council, Councillor P Farrington drawing his attention to the fact that local residents are extremely concerned that the matter is still outstanding after a very considerable length of time caused by the Local Planning Authority's failure to implement the terms of the agreement. The Chairman asked for ideas on the way forward. Cllr Busby suggested taking legal action but said this could be costly and the meeting agreed to the Chairman's proposal to write to the Leader of the Borough Council copied to the Head of Planning and Councillors R Sutherland and M Winnington.

	Online Banking Policy
	Following agreement at the last meeting, the Chairman met the signatories with the exception of Cllr Hodgkins who was unavailable on 19 th January to discuss and draft an online banking policy. A draft policy was duly circulated to members for their comments. The policy was agreed and adopted for implementation as soon as possible. There are four signatories. The Chairman suggested standing down and proposed Cllr Wilkes to replace him which Cllr Wilkes agreed. Adoption of the online banking policy and replacement of one signatory was proposed by Cllr Busby and seconded by Cllr Allen. Unanimous.

17	20/03/23/17 Proposed Bus Shelter on Newport Road, Great Bridgeford
	Planning permission was granted for the bus shelter on 8 th February 2023 subject to an Arboricultural Method Statement being submitted to and approved by the Local Planning Authority. Roy Keyzor, Arboricultural Consultants were instructed to carry out this and on 26 th February a copy of their report was sent to Stafford Borough Council requesting pre-commencement approval to discharge this condition. On 15 th March Stafford Borough Council emailed to say that the application had been registered and requesting payment of £58.00 being the application fee. Payment of the fee of £58.00 was approved – proposed by Cllr Turnbull and seconded by Cllr Wilkes. Unanimous.
18	20/03/23/18 Update on the speed indicator devices in Great Bridgeford
	The third solar powered speed indicator device was installed adjoining Wayside, Eccleshall Road, Great Bridgeford on 5 th February with the help of Cllr Hodgkins and his brother David Hodgkins. The Chairman asked if grateful thanks to Cllr Hodgkins and his brother could be recorded for their tremendous assistance on this scheme particularly to Cllr Hodgkins for getting the welding done to the mounting pole. The Parish Council now have three solar powered devices in Great Bridgeford.
