	Peter Longstaff, on behalf of the residents of Great Bridgeford, thanked David Price, John Busby and Mark Hodgkins for their work in connection with the bus shelter project. It is now finished and ready for people to use.
	Robert Eld MOP commented that the hedges by Burley Heights in Seighford need cutting back.
	MOP has set up a petition for a play area to be installed in Seighford and would like to push for something.

	Cllr Winnington reported that the Greenway, Derrington is overgrown and is in the process of being cut back.

	a) The minutes of the meeting were approved as a correct record and were signed subject to the below amend. Proposed by Cllr Price Seconded by Cllr Turnbull. Unanimous.
	 Item 5 – Cllr Price, Cllr Hodgkins and Cllr Rose met at the playing field immediately after the meeting on 17th July 2023. Item 7 Cllr Turnbull said the wall of the bridge in Little Bridgeford, Worston Lane needs repairing. Fete was incorrectly spelt in items 7&8
	b) Matters arising not covered elsewhere on the agenda
	 Clerk has reported the potentially blocked gullies throughout Seighford The signpost at Blackhole Lane has been replaced Overgrown hedge in Newport Road, Great Bridgeford between the tennis courts and the Railway Cottages. Councillor Price reported that the parents of the owner of the land, Mr Mark Lunn have been trimming the overhanging branches and also clearing the pavement back to the roots of the hedge which has brought about a big improvement.

	Parish Councillors Report:
	<u>Derrington</u>
	• Cllr Allen raised concerns over the imminent road closures and asked if we could put any further information on the Village Hall notice board, FB and bus stop.
	 Cllr Wilkes said there had been some pleasing developments over the previously reported problems on the Greenway with cyclists and horse riders. Cllr Jack Rose has now attended the site three times to assess the problem and discuss suitable signage with Cllr Wilkes, including no horse riding and asking cyclists to slow down. Cllr Wilkes commented that some parts of the track need widening to remove some of the vegetation and asked if it was possible to get some volunteers to help with this. Cllr Wilkes

commented that he was disappointed that it took so long to get to this point, but was really pleased that this was now going in the right direction.

- Cllr Hayward contacted Saul Hocking re the increase in dog fouling on the Greenway. Mr Hocking has given Cllr Hayward some signs to display to see if they will help.
- There is a Staying Well visit on 27 September in Derrington Village Hall for anyone in Derrington to attend.
- Cllr Hayward and Cllr Busby visited the Derrington play field and noticed it needs cutting. Action: Clerk to check contract with SBC over how many cuts have been agreed.
- Cllr Hayward received a letter from a resident asking if permission had been given over moving Right of Way number 3 (Cllr Hayward suggested it might be number 5) and the stile which provide access to the Greenway. **Clerk to send to SCC for them to review.**

Great Bridgeford

Councillor Price reported that the bus shelter project was completed on 10th September and a very good job has been made of it including planting shrubs on either side. The Parish Council made a big contribution to the scheme with the Chairman carrying out all the ground works, including supplying the shuttering and supplying and laying the hardcore, the Parish Council paying for the bus shelter and Councillor Mark Hodgkins fetching ready-made concrete for the base from EFC at Lawnhead and shovelling the concrete into the prepared base which involved three journeys. Grateful thanks are expressed to the Chairman and Councillor Hodgkins for the considerable amount of work they put into the project. Cllr Price suggested to the Village Hall Chairman that they have an official opening which he said they would consider. It is now the responsibility of the Parish Council to insure and maintain the bus shelter. Action: Cllr Price to send the reinstatement cost to The Clerk so it can be added to the insurance

The graffiti on the railway bridge at Great Bridgeford still there. Action: Clerk to chase up.

Cllr Price said it would be worthwhile pushing for the need to have permanent traffic lights at Little Bridgeford as the temporary ones have worked well there. They will potentially cost £100k. Cllr Hayward recalled that Cllr Pert mentioned there was potential for some HS2 funding to towards these.

Cllr Turnbull saw a post of Facebook page about an attempted burglary on Jasmine Road, followed by further attempted break in nearby where some damage was done in the garden. Cllr Turnbull wanted to make people aware.

Seighford:

Cllr Hodgkins commented that permanent speed watch signs are needed in Seighford to comply with current regulations. Cllr Price said they previously had the same issue in Great Bridgeford. **Action: Clerk to speak to Michelle Shaker.**

	Clerk to amend form to a traffic light system so councillors can highlight urgent and longer term needs. Then plan of action needs to be decided and date to be completed by. Also need follow-up plan from Alan Dymond reports in future.
	Derrington playing field – Cllr Hayward asked if we can seek approval to gain quotes for 2 pieces of equipment that have been damaged and potential use of wood chip instead of tiles. Action: Clerk to get some quotes for woodchip.
	The Chairman said he wanted to push for a play area in Seighford and is looking to speak to landowner to try to agree a short term lease on this. Michael Eld, said the estate has been waiting for a response from Cllr Price and the Parish Council on the further discussion of this, including the provision of affordable housing and improved play facilities. Mr Eld referred to November's meeting where the estate said it is waiting for the council to respond and engage with the estate owner over the playground. Mr Eld said this discussion has not happened and no one from the Parish Council has been in touch. He said that the Parish Council had said a steering group would be formed with immediate effect and this group would engage with the estate. The Chairman responded and said he, alongside Cllr Hayward and Cllr Hodkins, would set up the steering group. Mr Eld said the previous threat of compulsory purchase was unacceptable and asked for it to be minuted that it was in fact the council that did not engage with the land owner. Action: Chairman to set up steering group and arrange meeting with Mr Eld.
	There is an issue of vehicles going through the ford. It is not designed for traffic and there are alternative routes.
15	18/09/23/15 Update on section 106 agreement in Seighford discussions with SBC
	The Chair and Cllr Price attended a meeting with Dean Piper on 14 th August and Mr Piper was going to appoint a case officer. Nothing has been heard back yet. A MOP said to consider whether it was actually needed and whether it would just create unnecessary disruption for no reason. Cllr Price said it was for SBC to enforce this agreement and transfer the land to Seighford Parish Council. MOP (house owner) said it does go onto his boundary, but it wasn't his responsibility to change anything as this was done by the original owners.

	MOP (house owner) said he would provide benches, flowers as a gesture to the Parish Council. The residents have been amazing and the MOP thanked residents for being so welcoming. MOP said it sounds like Parish Council is pushing for case officer, based on what grounds and this isn't what the local residents want. The chair said he wants it resolved either way so a line can be drawn under it once and for all. Cllr Price said he doesn't understand why the land hasn't been handed back to the Parish Council. MOP said this is an untrue statement and boundaries don't have to be precise and can be shown in a general way up to 3 metres.
